ABOUT JOHNNY GILL

Johnny Gill's career was given new life in 1987 when he replaced Bobby Brown in New Edition for the recording of "Heartbreak." In 1989, Gill was featured on "Where Do We Go from Here," a No. 1 R&B hit from Lattisaw's "What You Need" and "One Love," by saxophonist George Howard. His self-titled album "Johnny Gill" went Top 10 Pop and Platinum on the strength of four major singles made with Jam and Lewis or Babyface and L.A. Reid. "Rub You the Right Way," "My My My" and "Wrap My Body Tight" all topped the R&B chart while "Fairweather Friend," made it to No. 2. The album was nominated for a Grammy for Best R&B Vocal Performance. His second and third LP's, 1993's "Provocative" and 1996's "Let's Get the Mood Right," become Gold-Level sellers.

Gill stayed with New Edition and teamed up with Gerald Levert and Keith Sweat to form LSG, a group behind Top 10 pop albums in 1997 and 2003 and the No. 1 R&B single "My Body." Gill continues to release solo albums including "Still Winning," (2011), "Game Changer" (2014) and "Game Changer II," (2019).

ABOUT RALPH TRESVANT

Ralph Tresvant joined Bobby Brown, Ricky Bell, Michael Bivins and Ronald DeVoe to form the group New Edition. The group scored their first hit with "Candy Girl." The hits continued with "Is This the End," (No. 8 on the R&B charts), "Lost in Love," (No. 6 on the R&B charts), "Count Me Out," (Two weeks at No. 2 on the R&B charts), "Earth Angel," (No. 3 on the R&B charts), "Once

in a Lifetime Groove," (No. 10 on the R&B charts), "If It Isn't Love," (No. 2 on the R&B charts), "You're Not My Kind of Girl" (No. 3 on the R&B charts) and "Crucial," (No. 4 on the R&B charts). Tresvant's solo debut, "Ralph Tresvant," went Platinum, parking at No. 1 on the R&B charts for two weeks. The LP also yielded the charting hits "Stone Cold Gentleman," "Do What I Gotta Do" and "Rated X." His hit single, "Money Can't buy You Love," appeared in Damon and Marlon Wayans' movie "Mo' Money." Tresvant also appeared in the movie "House Party 2" and sang on the 1996 New Edition reunion album, "Home Again."
